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## 1. Questionnaire

The questionnaire for this project was supplied to Tebbutt Research by Transparency International. This was checked, edited, and confirmed by both organisations. The final questionnaire used contains five (5) main sections:

- Screener – Demographics & Selection Protocol
- Section A – Perception on Corruption
- Section B – Experiences with Corruption
- Section C – Attitudes Towards Corruption
- Section D – Socio-Demographics

All of the questions in this questionnaire (excluding the screener) are single response, some of which are based on rating scales such as 'Never' to 'Very frequently' and 'Strongly disagree' to 'Strongly agree'.

There were no open-ended questions, and no post-fieldwork coding was required.



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## 2. Target Population

### **Papua New Guinea**

Target: National, all adults.

Sample was drawn from all provinces (AR Bougainville, Central, Chimbu, East New Britain, East Sepik, Eastern Highlands, Enga, Gulf, Hela, Jiwaka, Madang, Manus, Milne Bay, Morobe, National Capital District, New Ireland, Northern, Southern Highlands, West New Britain, West Sepik, Western, Western Highlands)

### **Fiji**

Target: National, all adults

Sample was drawn from all provinces (Ba, Bua, Cakudrove, Kadavu, Lau, Lomaiviti, Macuata, Nadroga Navosa, Naitasiri, Namosi, Ra, Rewa, Rotuma, Serua, Tailevu).

NOTE: No interviews with females were achieved in Rotuma. This exclusion accounts for 0.1% of the adult population.

### **Solomon Islands**

Target: National, all adults

Sample was drawn from all provinces (Central, Choiseul, Guadalcanal, Honiara, Isabel, Makira-Ulawa, Malaita, Rennell & Bellona, Temotu/Eastern Islands, Western)

### **New Caledonia**

Target: National, all adults

Sample was drawn from the communes of Lifou, Maré, Ouvéa, Koné, Koumac, Poindimié, Pouembout, Houaïlou, Canala, Voh, Pouébo, Touho, Ouégoa, Poya, Ponérihouen, Kaala-Gomen, Hienghène, Poupou, Kouaoua, Nouméa, Dumbéa, Païta, Le Mont-Dore, Bourail, La Foa, Boulouparis, Thio, L'Île-des-Pins, Yaté, Moindou, Farino, Sarraméa.

NOTE: No interviews were achieved in the commune of Belep. Interviews were achieved with only one gender in the communes of Houaïlou, Touho, Ouégoa, Poupou, Kouaoua, Bourail, La Foa, L'Île-des-Pins, Yaté, Moindou. These exclusions account for 4% of the adult population.

### 3. Translations

The survey was offered in the English language in all countries except for New Caledonia and French Polynesia.

Common languages were also offered in Papua New Guinea, Fiji, Solomon Islands, Vanuatu, Samoa, Tonga and Tuvalu.

Where translations were offered, the questionnaire was translated in the local market by two independent translators. Where any discrepancies were found between the two versions, referred to a third local speaker to provide insight into the nuances of the differences, and the most appropriate version was selected.

Translations were provided to Transparency International for their own assessment. Any questions raised by TI regarding translation were back-translated and adjusted as necessary to achieve the best transfer of meaning.

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## 4. Scripting

The questionnaire was scripted using NIPO ODIN Developer as an online CATI project, allowing for full routing, piping, and logic checks. This survey script was thoroughly tested before the commencement of fieldwork and was managed using Nfield Manager. Random digit dialling based on the known possible range of phone numbers in each country was used to produce the number called to achieve the sample. The process of dialling these numbers, recording the outcomes of these dials, and tracking the fieldwork progress was managed using CSM (a telephone sample management system developed internally).

- Nipo Nfield – data collection
- CSM – sample management
- Access – regular review of data collected
- Surveycraft – weighting calculations
- SPSS – final data format





## 5. Pilot Survey

A pilot survey was conducted to assess:

- Correctness of the translations,
- Comprehension of question,
- Cultural sensitivities are accounted for.

Below is the outcome of this pilot survey, containing: the fieldwork dates; sample achieved by country; the average interview lengths (total and by section); and the specific feedback and responses.

Specific Feedback and Responses (Highlighted) from Pilot

Question	Feedback
Intro	<p>The intro text states, “on behalf of our clients”. Respondents are asking who is your client? Can we change this to maybe “we have been commissioned to carry out a survey?” This question mainly popped up from the Fiji respondents. Other countries were okay.</p> <p><b>Perfect, let’s incorporate this change</b></p> <p>At the introduction phase the respondents often ask the length of the interview and the interviewers mention that it takes 15 to 20 mins even though this is a separate question, SC6.</p> <p>This is fine, we can always mark it as an “OK to proceed” when we get to SC6 or we can reconfirm again by reading out the question.</p> <p>Overall, the introduction is fine, it is brief, not too lengthy, and we are also informing the respondents what the survey is about so they can expect what type of questions they will be asked.</p>
SC6	<p>Can we add this question to the introduction as part of it? Rather than having it as a separate question, as respondents often ask the length of interview before they agree to participate.</p> <p><b>Please, add the length of the interview as part of the introduction.</b></p>
Q17-18-19	<p>We expected respondents to be uncomfortable with the questions that mention sexual favours, however they were all okay in all countries excepting PNG.</p> <p>In PNG, we had one female respondent who was interviewed by a male interviewer. We had to hand the phone over to a female interviewer to go through these questions. There were no gender match issues with the bulk of the interview, but when it came to these questions there was silence and it took some time for the respondent to say they didn’t want to answer. Our quick-thinking team member suggested a female interviewer, and when the phone was passed over to a female interviewer, the respondent happily answered these questions.</p> <p>Upon reaching Q20, the phone was handed back to the male interviewer and the interview continued.</p> <p><b>We have to ensure the matching between interviewer and respondent gender from the beginning of the interview to avoid this sort of issues.</b></p> <p><b>Our reply: Because it is a random dial selection, we cannot tell the gender of the respondent until we have already screened and secured the interview. We always make an alternate gender interviewer available if need be.</b></p>



Q36	<p>Most of the options do not apply to the countries we are covering. For example, outer suburbs or outskirts of a big city. Respondents found it confusing and mentioned we only have rural and urban area, no suburbs but villages only.</p> <p>For these areas in the islands we prefer rural area, village, or settlement.</p> <p>We can handle this with briefing if you prefer?</p> <p>Let's adapt it to the characteristics of the country and make it easier for the responder. If there are countries whose demographic characteristics do not fit with the categories we have in the questionnaire, it is better to modify it. I accept your suggestions about the best way to address this problem.</p>
General Feedback	<p>Overall, there were no major issues faced that require any changes. Questions were well understood and received by respondents.</p> <p>Interviews were longer when respondents did more contact with any public service.</p> <p>If there was less contact with public service, then the interviews were shorter, around 20 minutes.</p> <p>We expect interview lengths to improve once fieldwork is underway as it will pick up speed with familiarity for the interviewing team.</p>



## 6. Data Collection

All fieldwork was completed by the Tebbutt Research field team, comprised of Pacific island nationals with management from the Operations Team, including specific Field Management and Supervisors.

Fieldwork Staffing included:

- Fieldwork Teams of Interviewers and Supervisors,
- Field Management full time across the project to manage all fieldwork components, and
- Operations management to oversee all field management and field teams.

Tebbutt Research field staff underwent training on the specifics of the project before commencing field. The training program included general practice and standards, briefing on the survey and interview guides, and the protocols in place for the project. The training program included lecture-style teaching, demonstrations, practical exercises, pilot interviews and teambuilding.

## 7. Data Processing

Within each country, a weighting matrix was assembled using the variables **region by gender** and **gender by age**.

The age groups used were 18-24 years, 25-34, 35-44, 45-54, 55-64 and 65+ years.

The level of region varied by country.

## 8. Quality Assurance and Control

Tebbutt Research employed quality control at multiple points in the process of data collection and analysis, with a view that the earlier a problem or omission is discovered, the easier and more quickly it can be addressed and corrected.

QC steps taken were:

- Field staff were trained in the proper use of the data collection instruments, including confirmation of unlikely or inconsistent responses, ensuring completion of all questions, and routing through the questionnaire.
- Each team was overseen by a Supervisor and Field Manager who observes a sample of work and conducted QC checks of questionnaires.
- Due to COVID-19 restrictions and the need for interviewers to work independently, 10% of all interviews were validated by call-back.
- A quality control team reviewed questionnaire completion daily. This is done progressively so that any systemic issues or comprehension errors could be addressed quickly.
- Questionnaires were scripted with logic checks, automatic routing, and restrictions on data types and ranges.



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## 9. Lessons Learned

Conducting interviewing across 17 countries simultaneously under COVID-19 restrictions created a larger management task than typical.

Where there are unusual circumstances, consideration should be given to the feasibility of simultaneous starts, and the possibility of a staged rollout.
